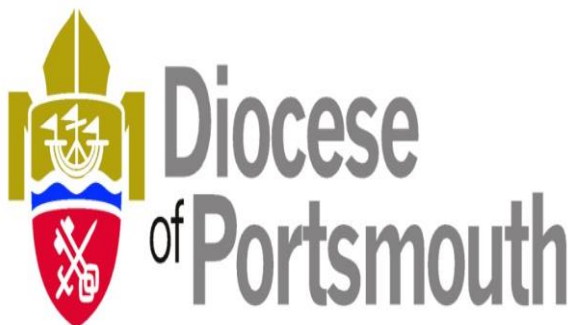


Pentecost Activities

Get Creative!



Flying flames

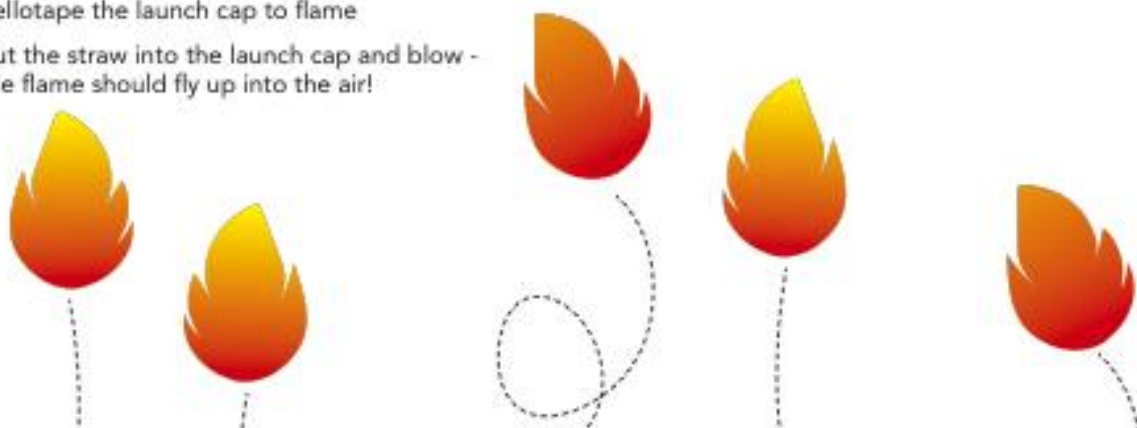


You will need

- Printed flames - print on card, or double sided paper. Ink can make the paper soft.
- A straw. We used paper straws, but plastic might be better in this activity (paper might go soggy after a few attempts!)
- Sellotape
- Small strip of paper to make the launch cap.

Instructions

- Colour in a flame and trim to edge
- Loosely roll a strip of paper around a straw, and seal with sellotape in the middle, and at the top. This is the launch cap, a bit similar to a pen lid. It should not be too tight. (You could also make this with a slightly bigger straw)
- Sellotape the launch cap to flame
- Put the straw into the launch cap and blow - the flame should fly up into the air!

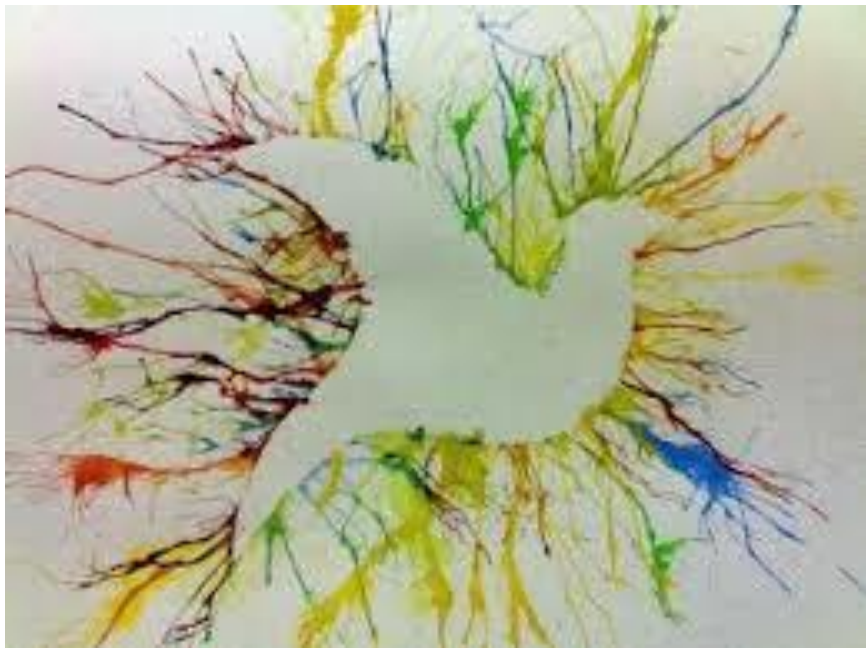

If you've got the kit for blow painting, these look very effective:



6. Decorate the body with words praising God in whatever different language you might know (There's cheat-sheet for if you don't know a different language! See below)
7. Bend the two wings out at right angles, one to each side.
8. Drop your gyrocopter from a high place or throw it in the air and watch it spiral down.
9. When everyone has finished making gyrocopters, throw them all into the air together and catch whichever one lands near you. Then everyone can shout aloud the praises of God in all the languages together – your own mini-Pentecost
