Dear All,

Revd Jax is away from the office today to celebrate her 60th birthday but Alan Disher, LLM Emeritus, has very kindly written a piece on Pentecost for me to send out in place of Revd Jax' regular letter.

PENTECOST

That first Pentecost was certainly dramatic although, in fact, *there was no wind*- just the sound of a mighty wind, heard even by those outside. Nor were there any flames of fire but flickering lights, looking like flames, that divided and rested on each person in the house. The crowd outside heard the great sound but would not have seen the lights.

Nevertheless, that first Day of Pentecost was certainly dramatic, unforgettable and life changing. We might wonder why, on that particular day, all the disciples were gathered together in one place. The most likely reason was that this was a special day for all Jews. Shavuot comes 50 days after the second night of the very first Passover in Egypt when the Israelite firstborn were protected from the angel of death by the blood of a Lamb smeared on the doors of their homes; 50 days later they celebrated their liberation from the living death of slavery in Egypt, to freedom through the power of God. Likewise, this first Pentecost took place 50 days after Jesus overcame death by the power of his resurrection and opened the way to true freedom, forgiveness, and the promise of eternal life with him in the Kingdom of God.

The immediate effect on anybody in the area was to discover that they could understand everything that those around them were speaking – people whose language was completely unknown to them. (It was as if the confusion of languages at the Tower of Babel, described in Genesis 11 v1 was becoming reversed - albeit temporarily).

The crowd was confused, *but Peter wasn't!* He took this great opportunity head-on, powerfully proclaiming Jesus as the resurrected Messiah and challenging them to repent and acknowledge Jesus as Lord and Christ. The impact of his sermon was inspiring: God's continuing presence was vividly seen by the response of the believers. "All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favour of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."

God has not changed. Why did the response of his people change so soon?

And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴ You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it.

“If you love me, keep my commands. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever— the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you.

John 14: 25-27

All this I have spoken while still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.
