All this came at a time when 100s of bishops from all over the world from the Anglican Communion were meeting at the Lambeth Conference – our senior leaders opening their hearts to God as they debated key issues of the day. 
I was particularly struck by the thought, though, that some did not attend – where was their voice, how did they contribute to the debate? Why had they given up on the process?

The bible makes the need for perseverance very clear – in what we do and say and in our prayer life.

Luke tells the story of a widow pestering a judge for justice in Chapter 18 of his Gospel, she just won't give up and eventually succeeds.

Paul says in his letter to the Romans (Ch 12)

'Be patient in trouble and keep on praying'.

In his letter to the Thessalonians, Paul says

'As for the rest of you, dear Brothers and Sisters, never get tired of doing good'

and tellingly, right at the beginning of his letter to the Twelve Tribes in the Dispersion, James says

"....the testing of your faith produces perseverance. Let perseverance finish its work so you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything."

Well, I'm not sure we're finely tuned athletes training and competing or bishops seeking to address the thorny issues of the day but I am sure we all face challenges from time to time and find ourselves wondering whether it's all too difficult and whether to stop, wondering where to find the strength and drive to carry on, to persevere. My reflection for us all today is that we look to the strength to be found in scripture and the Holy Spirit and the promises made to us by Jesus and just press on – it will be fine, we will succeed according to God's design and will for us He promises!
