'Stand firm, and you will win life. '(Luke 21: 19)
In 1919, Prime Minister, David Lloyd George commissioned architect, Sir Edward Lutyens, to design a temporary monument to commemorate those who had died during the First World War. Lutyens designed a cenotaph or 'empty tomb' made from wood and plaster which was placed on Whitehall. So popular was this memorial that within the first week of the Cenotaph's unveiling, over a million people came to lay wreaths and to pray for those who had died. Lutyens later created the permanent Cenotaph made from Portland stone we are familiar with today.

On 11 November 1920, King George V led a Remembrance Service from the Cenotaph as the Unknown Warrior made his final journey to Westminster Abbey. The addition of the Two Minute Silence in the Act of Remembrance came from Sir Percy Fitzpatrick, a South African author and politician. His idea was proposed to King George V in 1919, who immediately ordered that it should be held at 11 am on 11 November 1919.

On Armistice Day, on Friday of this week, I had the privilege of standing at the War Memorial in Wherwell, alongside a number of active military personnel and the entire cohort of Wherwell Primary School for a deeply moving service of remembrance. The children had walked in respectful silence from their school on Longparish Road and lined the grass triangle around the War Memorial, listening intently as I read out the all too long list of names of all those young local Wherwell men who lost their lives in two World Wars that we might stand together in peace.

Our particular thoughts were with the people of Ukraine as they continue to fight for freedom and justice in their country.

After the two minutes silence, the schoolchildren laid poppy wreaths on behalf of civic dignitaries and planted poppy crosses around the War Memorial. Anyone believing our young generations have lost their connection to our war dead ought to have seen the love and respect with which these wonderful young people stood in respectful honour this morning. Together, our voices rang out in prayer: We will remember them!
