A Reflection from Linda Hodgson – 1/6/21

To set the scene ... some words from a Girl Guide song ...

God has created a new day Silver and green and gold Live that the sunset may find us Worthy His gifts to hold.

We are surrounded, amazed and richly blessed by the natural world. God's world. The great designer, and the greatest artist is opening 'windows of wonder' to us every day, especially at this time of year.

The only gift that is greater than beauty is our awareness of it. When we get to heaven we won't be looking through windows, we'll be out in it!

The 'wilding' of gardens is becoming more relevant nowadays. Our great Creator is holding us all to account as climate change and pollution affects the whole world. We can thank God for our mainly gentle climate that allows us to enjoy our gardens.

But action and wisdom are overdue to look after God's world as we should.

May God help food provision and water aid for our brothers and sisters that need it badly. Our forests and oceans are being damaged and animals are becoming extinct.

We are made to praise God and glorify Him.

Jesus and Beelzebul

Then he went home; and the crowd came together again, so that they could not even eat. When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, "He has gone out of his mind." And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, "He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons." And he called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come.
