Climate Change - Food for thought!

In this festive season of wall to wall marketing by the supermarkets tempting us to over indulge at the dinner table it's perhaps appropriate to consider for a second the effects of food waste on the environment.

In the context of the climate emergency, WRAP produced a report which stated that interventions aimed at reducing food waste in the UK had the potential to reduce carbon dioxide emissions by 210,000 tonnes a year! On top of this, there are also a bunch of other benefits:

Supporting those in need

Interventions to reduce food-waste can include the re-distribution of surplus food from businesses and households to people in need, helping poorer families in the UK get access to nutritious food and reduce food poverty.

Financial savings

By reducing food waste, households can save money, as well as protect the environment. The Love Food Hate Waste campaign estimates that an average family of four can save just over £60/month by reducing their food waste!

On a wider scale, reducing food waste will have benefits for our macro economy as well. Food waste is costly for businesses producing, distributing and selling food, as well as for local governments collecting and treating food waste. In a 2015 report, WRAP estimates that the potential annual UK net benefits of reducing food waste were around £200 million in savings!

Environmental and ecological benefits

A lot of land is used to produce the food we needlessly waste; intensive farming can lead to destruction of habitats having a severe impact on our planet's biodiversity. Combined with a shift away from a predominantly meat-based diet, efforts to reduce food waste could lead to more sustainable food production enabling a reduction in the amount of land being used globally for food production. This would have a knock-on positive impact of protecting our global biodiversity and ecological systems.

From the water being used to produce our food, to the pollution it can cause in our rivers, and seas, the food industry is having a huge impact on our global water systems. The UN projections are that global demand for fresh water will exceed supply by 40% in 2030 and 86% of UK rivers currently do not meet good ecological standards!

The message is clear, shop for locally produced food, where possible, don't buy more than you need, and remember left overs can be turned into tasty and nutritious meals!

The December Work Day

The December Work Day was spent on the clearing of areas further along the bridleway, including the area where tree T27 was felled. Here, there was a lot of heavy timber still to be cut up and stacked, plus brash (small branches) to be broken up and burnt. A start was also made on coppicing some of the many Hazel stools in this area, to gather sticks for bench mending and fence building.

Replanting Trees

The replanting of the 15 new trees in the Phase 1 Ash Dieback area was completed in December. We decided to replant with smaller species of trees, which will produce more food and fruit for the HG wildlife and, we now have some Wild Cherry, Mountain Ash (Rowan) and Crab Apple, together with 2 Whitebeams and a Wild Service tree. Next HGCG Work Day

The next Work Day is now planned for Sunday 6th February, with the January WD having been cancelled for safety reasons due to the muddy conditions underfoot. Then, the work will be to continue the clearing of other areas further along the bridleway, and also to continue with coppicing.

Ash Die Back

The Phase 2b Ash Dieback felling programme has now been completed and, the felled trees will be cut up, with some stacked to form wildlife piles for insects and small mammals, and some moved to other areas of HG, where they will be turned into new benches.

For the future, we have noted that there are a few more Ash trees in very poor shape, that have not previously been listed for trimming/felling and, these will be monitored throughout the coming months to ensure the safety of HG users.

Waitrose Donation

Finally, some good news for the Group – we have recently received a £500 donation from our local Waitrose store, as part of their “Give a Little Love” scheme, to help improve our local environment. We will be considering how best to use this donation and, quite possibly it could be used to buy more trees, to replant in the areas of HG where Phase 2 of the Ash Dieback felling has recently been completed.
